We have at present molds for wheel fairings used on the sarly Arenca's, they are just right for the Ace using 700 or 600 tires. I would be pleased to have you list these for the Ace. If you are interested we can work out the costs, ect.

Dont think I will be able to make the Rockford Fly-In, as a matter of fact, I have never been able to yet, but still have hopes that I will make it one of these days.

If by chance, you should know of any young man up your way who is really interested in getting into aircraft designing and building work, one who is willing to do it the hard way!
